CURRICULUM POLICY

STATEMENT OF INTENT

The ArtsEd Sixth Form is a vocational performing arts school committed to developing the talents of its students both academically and vocationally to the highest possible level. Both facets of the education provided bear equal importance, and the school's aspiration is to produce highly qualified, thoughtful, interesting and interested young people who have developed their performing talents to such a degree that they are able to continue in vocational training if they so wish.

The following information relates to the Curriculum Offer for 2020–2021. As a Sixth Form we are always reviewing and working to improve our offer in light of student interests. Therefore, the curriculum for future years cannot be guaranteed to be the same as this one. Subject matter will be appropriate for the ages and aptitudes of the students, including those with EHC (educational health care) Plans.

Once a year (Normally during the Summer Term) we suspend the timetable to deliver a Cross Curricular Programme across the whole school with an agreed focus. Students have the chance to take part in a variety of tailor-made activities, with a strong SMSC (spiritual, moral, social and cultural) focus.

Our curriculum at Key Stage 5 (Years 12 and 13)

The ArtsEd Sixth Form curriculum aims to provide our students with an inspiring and challenging education, specialising in the creative and performing arts. We aim to enhance and refine the skills students bring from GCSE while offering high-level training in the arts. We expect our students to engage fully in their education and provide for them a strong academic and vocational base from which they can forge independent career and study paths. Our students are as likely to be offered university places as they are to be offered performance-based training and, as such, we aim to offer a curriculum that is both academically rigorous and vocationally challenging.

We aspire for our students to be interested in learning as well as in developing their own informed thoughts and ideas. Staff discuss their subjects regularly with each other and are therefore able to create cross-curriculum links for students. Students are encouraged to see their subjects as part of life and are repeatedly and actively encouraged to see as many plays, dance performances, exhibitions and platform discussions as possible.

Our academic and vocational offers are supported by a strong pastoral philosophy and PSHEE programme. This endeavours to empower students to be confident, safe and resilient individuals, with the inter-personal and critical thinking skills required for success in the wider community.

We expect our students to demonstrate passion and commitment to the worlds of the creative and performing arts. Students may choose to follow either the A Level pathway or a mix of A Levels and an Extended Diploma in BTEC Performing Arts (Musical Theatre, Acting or Dance) From 2020 Y12 students will be studying Level 3 BTEC Performing Arts Practice (Musical Theatre, Acting or Dance). Those with a

passion for dance on either course may be considered to attend additional Dance Stream classes.

Students in Years 12 and 13 may be left on their own at times, e.g. when they are working on devised pieces/own choreography, independent study. In all cases, it is made clear to the students that a responsible adult can be readily contacted if needed.

A Level subjects offered

The subjects offered at A Level are:

Art, Dance, Drama, English Literature, French, History, Film Studies, History of Art, Mathematics, Photography and Politics.

A Level pathway

Students who select this course choose to study three or four subjects at A Level. The majority of our students will choose either Dance or Drama as one of these subjects. Students are encouraged to select subjects that offer them a balanced A Level range. All students are required to study a minimum of three A Levels in Year 13.

BTEC Extended Diploma in Performing Arts (Dance/Acting/Musical Theatre)

The BTEC Extended Diploma in Performing Arts is a two-year course that provides students, upon completion, with a qualification equivalent to three A Levels. The course is assessed continuously, with students undertaking classes in Acting, Dance and Singing by means of various assignments. Evidence for learning is provided by the students' logbook, written work and by practical performance. Students will provide coursework that reflects an understanding of the historical context of their work, and shows an ability to research and develop their own ideas. The BTEC produces students who are fully rounded individuals, being practitioners in their own right and confident and knowledgeable individuals. There will be an opportunity for students to study an additional one or two A Level subjects. Students might be encouraged to consider subjects not included as part of the BTEC, such as English, Film Studies and Art.

Key Stage 5 Dance stream

The Dance stream is aimed at students who show potential in dance and are interested in complementing their area of study with additional classes. The course may include classes in Ballet, Jazz, Contemporary and ISTD Modern, and maybe invited to join additional tap classes. Students wishing to pursue this option will need to audition.

Enrichment classes: Two classes per week.

Beyond the examination classes, the school also offers a programme of classes designed to broaden students' experience. During timetabled enrichment lessons, students can choose from a variety of subject options; for example in the past students have taken, Yoga, the ArtsEd Musical Theatre Company, ArtsEd Theatre Company, Acting for Screen, Script Reading, Silent Study, Accent classes, Stage Combat, Show Choir etc. We consider these non-exam classes an important opportunity for students to extend their performance skills and expose them to performance areas they might not have considered otherwise.

(Due to Covid19 our enrichment programme will not currently start until the second term, some enrichment classes will be slowly introduced to the timetable however this is flexible due to the current situation and change of school times).

Re-take GCSE's

If a student does not reach the required minimum grade of 4 or above for English or Maths GCSE they are strongly advised to attend re-take classes and re-sit the exam either in the November or the following summer dependent on their need of revision preparation. We try our very best to fit these extra lessons into the students silent study times however if this is not possible students must be aware that they could be made to take these additional classes during the Enrichment lessons allocated in their weekly timetable. Students are encouraged to seek help from teachers and be self motivators in applying themselves to re-sit GCSE exams.

Additional Enrichment Opportunities.

There are many extra classes that run outside the curriculum, for which students are welcome to register their interest.

Language BONUS programme

The PSHEE programme aims to develop students' critical thinking skills, self-awareness and self-knowledge, as well as their sex and relationships education and study skills; support for higher education applications is also provided. Moreover, once a year (normally during the Summer Term) we suspend the timetable to deliver a cross curricular programme across the whole school with an agreed focus. Students have the chance to take part in a variety of tailor-made activities with a strong SMSC focus.

ArtsEd's **Young EntrepreneurS (YES) Programme** is run in partnership with **The Results Driven Group**, a leading training provider based in the UK who run a suite of Level 5 (degree) and Level 7 (Masters) courses for The Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) and The Chartered Management Institute (CMI).

*(Due to Covid19 some extracurricular opportunities will not start until the second term, however peripatetic lessons and PSHEE will be running).
