Summary of the role:		
	The successful candidate will be joining a highly talented Performing Arts Team many of whom bring industry experience to the department of 26 teachers and 11 peripatetic staff. Working as part of this team, you will support the Head of Drama in the planning and delivery of the drama curriculum; contributing to the teaching students at KS3 - KS5 including GCSE, A Level and LAMDA. This will include the ability to support the students academically as well as in the planning, preparation, rehearsal and performance of large and small scale productions within the Performing Arts. All staff at ArtsEd are expected to sustain and improve the quality of training and education that is offered to the pupils in the school. Our ethos is one of shared responsibility to which all teachers make a significant contribution. You will be expected to generate, along with the other members of successful department, the vision and ethos for the course and work together to develop the most innovative core units for students.

ArtsEd has its origins in schools founded in 1919 by Grace Cone and 1922 by Olive Ripman. The Cone and Ripman schools were pioneers in providing talented children with an academic education alongside specialised training in dance, drama, music, and art, preparing young people for professional careers in or connected with the theatre. In 1939 the two schools amalgamated to become the Cone Ripman School.

Today ArtsEd continues to support a co-educational, independent vocational school for pupils aged 11–18 years as well as a professional conservatoire for students in Higher Education. The schools exist in separate parts of the same building, creating a unique and inspirational creative environment for all.

ArtsEd is extremely proud of its outreach programme which is central to their commitment to ensure inclusivity across everything they do. Building strong links with youth groups and schools, ArtsEd aims to provide talented

young people with a clear pathway to vocational training and to introduce them to the unique energy and passion required for a career in the performing arts.
