Summary of the role:

We are seeking an inspiring and adaptable teacher of Photography and Art to join our creative team at a vibrant and nurturing independent performing arts school. The appointed person would be expected to teach throughout the School from Year 7 – Year 13, but with a predominance of A level teaching.

This is a unique opportunity for a passionate educator with a strong photographic practice to guide and stretch students fostering a deep understanding of technical skill, personal expression and a love of the visual arts world. The role would suit either an early career teacher or a teacher seeking further experience, and the ideal candidate will be confident delivering digital photography while also contributing meaningfully to the wider Art curriculum.

The Visual Arts Department is staffed by four specialist teachers working across a suite of three dedicated Art studios. At GCSE and A level, students follow the Edexcel Fine Art and Photography specifications, and public examination results are consistently excellent. A significant number of students have progressed to leading visual arts institutions, including University of the Arts London, City and Guilds and Kingston University. Throughout the school, curated displays of outstanding student work celebrate the high standard and creative ambition of our students.

Art is taken seriously by all students, who rise to the high expectations set by staff, regardless of their starting point. Teachers provide exceptional support and foster a nurturing yet ambitious environment. While academic success is celebrated, our approach prioritises originality, curiosity, and individual expression. Students are encouraged to explore and refine technical skills while developing thoughtful, personal responses to the world around them. - Exhibit a genuine passion for the Visual Arts, embracing both traditional techniques and contemporary practices.
- To contribute to the teaching of the KS3 KS5 curriculum in Photography and Art including GCSE and A Level, with experience in delivering both to A-Level highly desirable
- Deliver high-quality teaching in both Photography and Art across Key Stages, fostering technical proficiency, creative thinking, and critical engagement.
- Plan and assess practical and conceptual projects with a focus on skill development, personal response, and alignment with exam board specifications (Edexcel Fine Art and Photography).
- Support students in developing visual literacy and subject-specific analytical skills, particularly in written components such as artist analysis and project evaluations.

- Ensure the safe and effective use of specialist resources, including digital and studio equipment. Upholding all health and safety procedures and protocols; including the preparation and implementation of risk assessments.
- Support the Head of Department in the monitoring and maintain all departmental equipment and materials related to Photography and Art, ensuring they are kept in good working order and are safely stored.
- Support the Head of Department in the care and routine maintenance of specialist facilities, including photography studio, studio lighting and other equipment.

Background to ArtsEd

ArtsEd originated from two schools - one founded in 1919 by Grace Cone and the other in 1922 by Olive Ripman. These two pioneers in education believed passionately in the value of combining a general academic education with specialised training in dance, drama, music and art. They were committed to preparing young people for professional careers in or related to the theatre. In 1939, Grace and Olive joined forces to create the Cone Ripman School, subsequently named the Arts Educational Schools. Dame Alicia Markova and Sir Anton Dolin drew almost exclusively on ArtsEd students to help them create their revolutionary company London Festival Ballet, which eventually became the English National Ballet. Ballerina Dame Beryl Grey became Director of the Schools in the 1960s.

ArtsEd continued to innovate, introducing both professional acting and musical theatre courses and in 1986 moved to its present home in Chiswick. In 2007, Lord Andrew Lloyd Webber became President, heralding an auspicious new era for ArtsEd. The Day School and Sixth Form remains the leading school of its kind in the UK with all students possessing outstanding creativity and dedication. Academic results and vocational success are significant and our Value Added return is in the top 1% nationally. The School of Musical Theatre and School of Acting offer full-time BA and MA courses. Our Musical Theatre course is recognised as the best in the UK, while the Acting course is praised for its innovative 50:50 split between stage and screen acting. Our outstanding record of graduate success sees nearly every one of our Musical Theatre graduates and over three-quarters of our Acting graduates make their professional debuts within six months of graduating.

In additional to vocational training and significant success in the creative arts, each year a number of ArtsEd students move on to Russell Group universities where they study a range of more traditional academic subjects.
