## ArtsEd Higher Education

ArtsEd is one of the UK's leading providers of degree-level conservatoire education. Our Foundation, BA and MA courses in Musical Theatre and Acting, create graduates who are innovative and resilient performers. We prepare our students for both the physical and mental rigours of the performing arts industry through a combination of outstanding vocational training and focused pastoral care. The success of our approach has led to our alumni playing a key role in the success of the UK's creative economy for many years and they include choreographers, directors, and producers, as well as performers.

## What do we offer?

The energy and passion at ArtsEd are tangible. We are a small, close-knit team, committed to supporting all of our students to achieve their best. ## Summary of the role:

What are we looking for?

This position is a permanent, full-time role within ArtsEd. We are committed to changing the way that performers are trained for the modern industry. The person appointed should ideally bring a balance of professional and teaching skills to ensure that ArtsEd remains a leader in the world of professional Musical Theatre training. The School of Musical Theatre currently offers a BA (Hons) and Cert HE which are validated by City, University of London. The current intake is 50 BA (Hons) & 30 Foundation students per year, with some funding via the Dance and Drama Awards scheme. There is also an active programme of outreach and short-course activity. The successful applicant will need to work closely with the Head of Music to ensure the highest standards of singing and musical education are maintained for the students, and in order to maintain a high level of morale and co-operation across the busy Music department as we carry out our day-to-day activities with good humour and a positive, 'can-do' approach.

# Key Responsibilities

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- Promoting and safeguarding the welfare of young persons for whom you are responsible and with whom you come into contact.
- Contributing towards the efficient, safe and effective provision of high-quality Musical Theatre training.
- To teach a range of classes from the current music and singing curriculum, further details of which are outlined below.
- Contributing towards maintaining the highest quality teaching of singing and music and associated subjects throughout the School of Musical Theatre.
- Contributing towards curriculum review processes, as appropriate.
- To be a member of the Musical Theatre School Executive team.
- To be a Personal Tutor as set out in the school's Personal Tutor policy.
- This role may eventually include other pastoral responsibilities – including, but not limited to, a Head of Year responsibility.
- Participation in the audition selection process.
- To take part in external concerts and events as required.
- To mark and assess student progress through written Critical Reflection journals, practical classwork elements, projects and performances as required, and during the assessment period at the end of the academic year.
- Monitoring student attendance and maintaining discipline amongst the student body.

## Teaching Responsibilities

As advised by the Head of Music, to teach/MD a combination of:

- Ensemble singing classes
- 1-2-1 repertoire/singing lessons
- Musical Theatre Skills Consolidation projects
- Singing & Music projects
- Song Workshop classes

Across the Foundation Cert H.E. Course and BA (hons) course. This list is not exhaustive; there may be additional requirements from time to time and the post may evolve in line with the strengths and ambitions of the employee, in agreement with the Head of Music and Course Director.

This is a full-time post with most working responsibility taking place during term time, but with other duties which occur throughout the year, including team meetings, auditions, events, assessments and training.

- Providing excellent support to help students perform at their best, through motivating and developing them to achieve high performance.

- Providing clear guidance, instruction, advice and coaching to students
- Developing effective teamwork e.g., effective communication, consulting on shared aims.

## Background to ArtsEd

ArtsEd originated from two schools, one founded in 1919 by Grace Cone and one founded in 1922 by Olive Ripman. These two educational pioneers believed passionately in the value of combining a general academic education with specialised training in dance, drama, music and art. They were committed to preparing young people for professional careers in or related to the theatre. In 1939, Grace and Olive joined forces to create the Cone Ripman School, subsequently named the Arts Educational Schools. Dame Alicia Markova and Sir Anton Dolin drew almost exclusively on ArtsEd students to help them create their revolutionary company London Festival Ballet, which eventually became the English National Ballet. Ballerina Dame Beryl Grey became Director of the Schools in the 1960s.

ArtsEd continued to innovate, introducing both professional acting and musical theatre courses and in 1986 moved to its present home in Chiswick. In 2007, Lord Andrew Lloyd Webber became President, heralding an auspicious new era for ArtsEd. The Day School and Sixth Form remains the leading school of its kind in the UK with all students possessing outstanding creativity and dedication. Academic results and vocational success are significant, and our Value-Added return is in the top 1% nationally. The School of Musical Theatre and School of Acting offer full-time BA and MA courses. Our Musical Theatre course is recognised as the best in the UK, while the Acting course is praised for its innovative 50:50 split between stage and screen acting. Our outstanding record of graduate success sees nearly every one of our Musical Theatre graduates and over three-quarters of our Acting graduates make their professional debuts within six months of graduating.

In addition to vocational training and significant success in the creative arts, each year a number of ArtsEd students move on to Russell Group universities where they study a range of more traditional academic subjects, including English.
